### REGULATIONS FOR MAINTAINING DISCIPLINE.

SANCTIONED BY THE BOARD OF TRADE IN PURSUANCE OF SEC. 114 (2) OF THE MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1894.

Tipese Regulations are distinct from, and in addition to, those contained in the Act, and are sunctioned but not universally required by Law. All or any of them may be adopted by agreement between a Master and his Crew, and thereapon the offences specified in such of them as are so adopted will be legally punishable by the appropriate Fines or punishments. The Regulations, however, are not to apply to Certificated Officers.

These Regulations are all numbered, and the numbers of such of them as are

adopted must be inserted in the space left for that purpose in the Agreement, page 1, and the following copy of these Regulations must be made to correspond with the Agreement by crasing such of the Regulations as are not adopted. The signature or initials of a Superintendent of a Mercantile Marino Office, Consular, or other Officer before whom the Agreement is made must be placed opposite such

of the Regulations as are adopted. For the purpose of legally enforcing any of the following penalties, the same steps must be adopted as in the case of other Offences panishable under the Act; that is to say, a statement of the Offence must, immediately after its commission, be entered in the Official Log Book by the direction of the Master, and must at

the same time be attested to be true by the signatures of the Master and the Mate, or one of the Crow; and a copy of such outry must be furnished, or the same must be read over to the Offender, before the ship reaches any Port or departs from the Port at which she is; and an entry that the same has been so furnished or read over, and of the reply, if any, of the Offender, must be made and signed in the same manner as the entry of the Offence. These entries must, upon discharge of the Offender, be shewn to the Superintendent of a Mercantile Marine Office before whom the Offender is discharged; and if he is satisfied that the Offence is proved, and that the entries have been properly made, the Fine must be deducted from the Offender's wages, and paid over to

If, in consequence of subsequent Good Conduct, the Master thinks fit to remit or reduce any fine muon any Member of his Crew, which has been entered in the Official Log, and signifies the same to the Superintendent, the Fine shall be remitted or reduced accordingly. If wages are contracted for by the Voyage or by Share, the amount of the Fines is to be ascertained in the manner in which the Amount of Forfeiture is ascertained in similar cases under Sec. 234.

# Instructions to Masters of Vessels engaged in the Home Trade.

(The term "Souman" includes every person, except Masters, Plots and Apprentices (duly indentured and registered), employed or engaged in any capacity on board any
- Neglect to comply with this regulation subjects the Master or Owner to a ponalty not exceeding £5 for every offence.
- 3. In order to enable the Seaman to know the contents of the Agreement, the Master must cause the Agreement to be read over and explained to each Seaman, and the Seaman will thereupon sign the same in the presence of a witness, who shall attent his

- 5. All alterations in may Agreement (except additions in shipping substitutes) are inoperating unless proved to have been made with the consent of all persons interested, by the written attestation of a Superintendent of a Mercantile Marine Office, Justice, Officer of Customs, Consul or Vice-Consul, or where there is no such Officer, of two respectable British Merchants.
