-YEARLY AGREEMENT AND ACCOUNT OF VOYAGES AND CREW

OF A SHIP ENGAGED IN THE HOME TRADE ONLY,

And Official Log Book for a Vessel exclusively employed on the Coasts of the United Kingdom.

18 Notice. This Agreement is to be used only for Voyages made on the Coasts of the United Kingdom, or to the Islands of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Isle of Man, or to places on the Continent of Europe between the Biver Elbe and Brest, inclusive. The Crew need not be engaged before a Superintendent. On whatever date the Agreement is made it expires on the next following 30th day of June or 31st day of December, as the case may be, and is then, or within 21 days afterwards, to be delivered to the Superintendent of a Mercantile Marine Office. If however, the Ship is absent from the United Kingdom on the 30th day of June or 31st day of December, then this Agreement remains in force until the first arrival of the Ship at her final port of destination in the United Kingdom after such day, or the discharge of cargo consequent on such arrival, when it is to be delivered up to a Superintendent.

On this Agreement and Account of Crew being duly completed and deposited at a Mercantile Marine Office, the Superintendent will issue the Certificate C.C., to enable

the Ship to be cleared at the Custom House.

Neglect to deposit the returns within the time prescribed by the Merchant Shipping Act subjects the owner or Master to a penalty, and will lead to delay in the issue of the Clearance Certificate and consequent detention of the Ship.

## REGULATIONS FOR MAINTAINING DISCIPLINE.

SANCTIONED BY-THE BOARD OF TRADE IN PURSUANCE OF SEC. 114 (2) OF THE MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1894.

CONDITIONS AND EXCEPTIONS IN APPLYING SCALE.

The issue of provisions for which a total weekly, and no daily, amount is given in the above scale shall be reasonably distributed throughout the week.

6. Fresh vegetables, or vegetables preserved in tins, to one ounce of dried or compressed vegetables.

7. A mixture of coffee and chicory containing not less than seventy-five per cent. of coffe

8. The dried fruit issued under the above scale must be raisins, sultanas, currants, figs, or prunes.

9. The onions to be issued under the above scale must be fresh onions when in season; and, when fresh onions are not in season, an equal amount of onions must be issued.

(a) soft bread shall be issued in lieu of biscuit; and
 (b) when procurable at a reasonable cost, a pound and a half of fresh meat and half a pound of fresh vegetables need not be issued.
 11. The stokehold hands are to receive sufficient oatmeal and one quart of water extra daily while under steam.
